4. <u>Committee Restructuring (Chrissy 5 min)</u>

As an organization CFAC needs to reorganize and restructure the committees to be more effective and to increase communication.

• Rationale: it's been pointed out by multiple committees that they are operating outside of the original scope and purpose of the committee. By reorganizing, creating roles and guidance on scope and path of work we can streamline processes, and delegate accordingly. This will also provide guidance on how committees work together to move us forward towards our objective. This will also improve communication within the organization and between committees and the rest of the coalition. This will move CFAC to a less centralized, top down structure and move towards more horizontal leadership.

5. **Proposed committee structure** (Chrissy 5 min)

- All of the committees will conduct business and tasks at the direction and guidance of the organizational goals and strategic plan and Planning Committee. The planning committee will create the specific language and duties for each committee. It is also noted that there will be overlapping of some tasks between the committees. This increases collaboration and accountability.
- **Budget & Finance Committee** Will handle creating the Budget, financial Oversight, fundraising, grant writing and oversight etc.
- Outreach & Engagement Committee Will handle event planning and management, marketing and advertising, social media, newsletter, contact information database, membership management and compliance, coalition recruitment.
- **Programming & Partnerships Committee** establishes and manages strategic Partnerships and collaborations, establishes the program offerings with partners and community resources to fill community needs, develop new programs with partners when needed, responsible for developing and overseeing deliverables for programs and those related to grant reporting, oversee logistics and management of programs and workshops. Will also be responsible for collaborations and relationships with strategic partners on special projects.
- Planning Committee Or leadership committee Executive committee, and committee chairs, other strategic members as identified or when organizational need arises-establishes a clear line of communication and creates a more collaborative form of organizational management, creates a system of accountability for all, oversees the work of all committees, creates plans and tasks that are delegated to the committees and guides the work of the committees inline with organizational goals and strategic plan, oversees and ensures overall compliance issues and reports, acts as a checks and balance for all committees.

- Can we work on more individualized pricing? Ala Carte Pricing YES
- What is currently offered for education and engagement of the community? Producers?
 - ABCs of sustainability and after school program- 46218 program education
 - Capacity building training program for farmers
 - Assist farmers with increasing their capacity through online sales, value added products, selling at markets, different laws and regulations
 - Indiana Grown Members Producers
 - Currently 6 farms that come in to package product, have in store front, and meet customers
 - Has done multiple seed to table educational workshops and programs
- What is needed to build capacity for your food hub?
 - More cold storage and regular storage (outdoor cool bots)
 - More online marketing, Indiana Grown- letting people know that farmers that re a part of the hub are also a part of
 - Assistance with marketing
 - Equipment Freeze Dryer, Dehydrator (currently working on grant funding but there are limitations with the grant for using the equipment)
 - Getting signed up with SNAP and EBT/ Fresh Bucks February when the system starts online
 - Setting up a storefront that is open regularly
 - Refrigeration and freezer space
- Food Hub model
- Allows communities to individualize the food hub in their neighborhood to meet their needs, rather than a one size fits all city wide project.
- Puts the power into the hands of the people. Local Producers, local consumers, local money stays local localized food economy.

Indy CFAC leadership is already working on action lists and plans that will move us towards working with Faith to support Indy's Culinary Food Hub and a more localized food economy.
